By Train

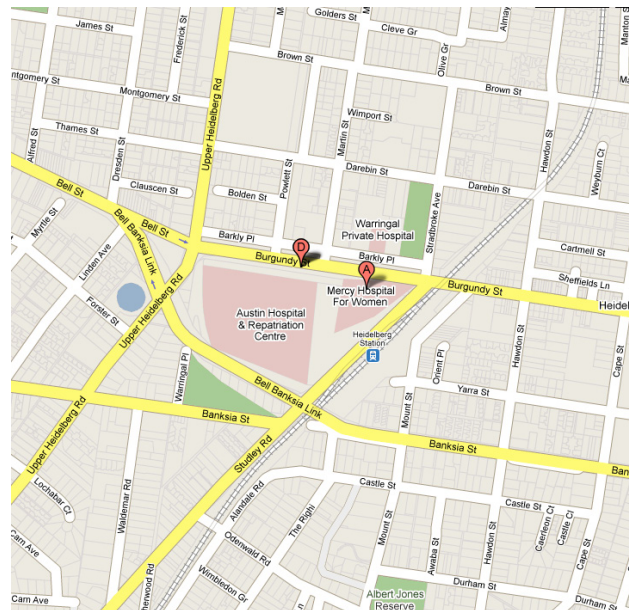
Mercy Hospital for Women is situated at the corner of Burgundy Street in Heidelberg, approximately 10km from Flinders Station.

1800-1835 3rd Degree Tears; Can we prevent the problems?

Liz Thomas RM, CNC & Dr Joseph Lee, Fellow in Urogynaecology

Liz and Joseph will present current evidence relating to risk factors, diagnosis, assessment and management of obstetric anal sphincter injury (OASI). Objectives for providing optimal clinical care in the immediate and short term post natal period will be reviewed. Referral pathways to the Urogynaecology Unit will be identified.

1835-1910 PPH & Amniotic embolism: Misses and near Misses: Maternal Mortality and Morbidity in Childbirth.

Associate Professor Sue Walker, Director Perinatal Medicine.

Postpartum haemorrhage and amniotic fluid embolism are major contributors to maternal mortality, near miss events and ICU admission. This presentation will cover risk factors, diagnosis, optimal management and the importance of a systematic well coordinated multidisciplinary approach in order to improve these adverse outcomes.

1910-1945 Preeclampsia: High Pressure Issues for the Birthing Team.

This presentation will focus on the key management issues with regard to preeclampsia, for the multidisciplinary birthing team, including recognition of the critically ill pregnant woman, management of hypertension, prevention and treatment of seizures and planning for delivery.

1945-2020 Nutrition in Labour: Food for Thought.

Melissa Mazzarino, RM Birth Suite MHW

Provision of fluids and food to low-risk women in labour: Views, knowledge and practice of midwives working in a tertiary birth suite.

Midwives' provision of food and fluids in labour, specifically the type of fluid and food as well as the amount deemed appropriate to provide low risk labouring women remains controversial. A team of 5-6 birth suite midwives developed an audit tool in the form of questionnaire to ascertain midwives' practices in this area. The survey comprised of questions on 6 aspects of practice regarding the provision of food and fluids in labour, the results of which will be presented.
